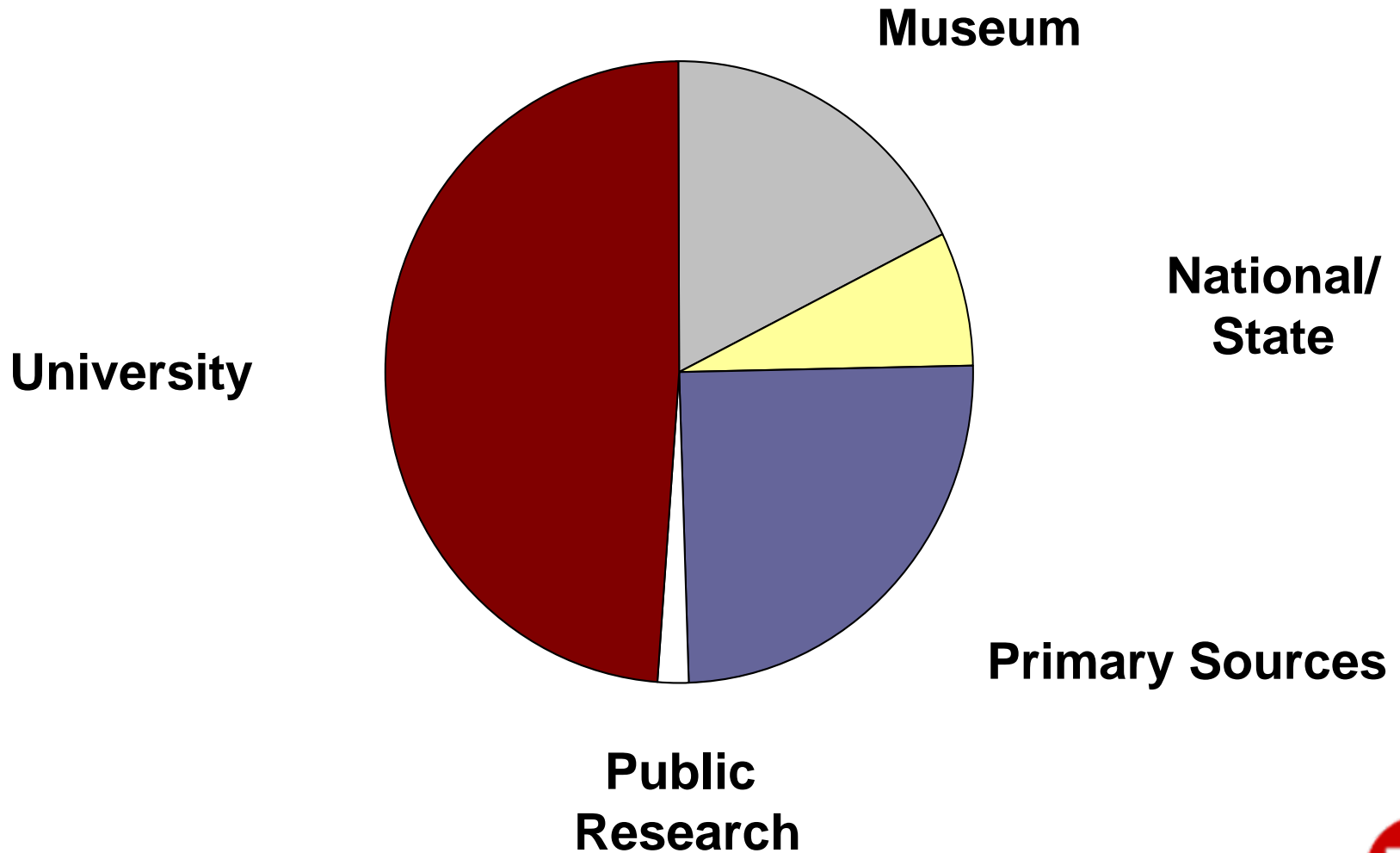

For researchers seeking information about archival resources, a bibliographic record is only part of the access process. Finding aids are tools for navigation within archival collections, and contain detailed information about the collections. The bibliographic record can be used as a link to an electronic finding aid and the finding aid can also serve as a link to actual archival materials that have been digitized.



RLG's Archival Resources provide centralized access for searching and retrieval of archival finding aids that have been encoded using SGML and the emerging standard for Encoded Archival Description (EAD). The finding aids are indexed centrally at RLG but are supported in a distributed environment — some reside on a server at RLG, others are located on other servers around the world.

Archival Resources also includes access to RLG's AMC (Archival and Mixed Collections) file. AMC provides researchers with timely and comprehensive access to brief, high-level information for nearly half a million collections of manuscripts and archives, and has greatly enhanced the dissemination of information about the holdings in repositories around the world.

INDIA OFFICE RECORDS: GENERAL DESCRIPTION

From the administrative and archival point of view, the official records relating to Indian emigration and Indians overseas during the period 1830-1947 fall into two broad divisions:

1. Records of the principal London offices responsible for British government in India and Burma (the East India Company, the Board of Control, the **India Office** and the Burma Office)
2. Proceedings of the Government of India and the provincial governments, which were copied to London for information.

Each of these divisions consists of a number of main groups or sections, which in turn are made up of various separate series of volumes or files. The following are only summary details of these records, but more detailed descriptions of most of the individual files belonging to the first broad category for the period 1920-1947 are given in the following sections of this guide.

Petition to the Centurion

Date: 25th year of the Emperor Caracalla, 26th of the Egyptian month Choiak.

Translation: To Aurelius Julius Marcellinus, centurion, from Aurelia Tisais, whose mother is Tais, formerly styled as an inhabitant of the village of Tebtunis in the division of Polemon. My father Kalabalis, Sir, who is a hunter, set off with my brother Neilos as long ago as the 3rd of the present month to hunt hares, and up to this time they have not returned. I therefore suspect that they have met with some accident, and I present this statement making this matter known to you, in order that if they have met with any accident the persons found guilty may be held accountable to me. (2nd h.) I happen to have also presented a copy of this notice to the strategos Aurelius Idiomachos to be placed on the register. (1st h.) The 25th year of Marcus Aurelius Severus Antoninus Caesar the Lord, Choiak 26.

Content: Aurelia Tisais, daughter of Kalibalis and Tais, petitions Julius Marcellinus, centurion, stating that her father and brother had disappeared on a hunting trip.

Paleographic description: Two hands: 1, lines 1-15 and 19-21 (body of petition and date) regular rather large cursive; 2, lines 16-18 (postscript), regular cursive, very smudged.

Lines: 21 lines, on recto along the fibers.

Physical properties: Margins: top, 1 cm.; left, 2 cm.; bottom, 6.5 cm.; on verso, in black ink: T 7 (3 times).

Publication status: published

Section/Side: Verso: traces of lines 16-18 (apparently the ink was still wet when the papyrus was rolled from right to left). Verso otherwise empty

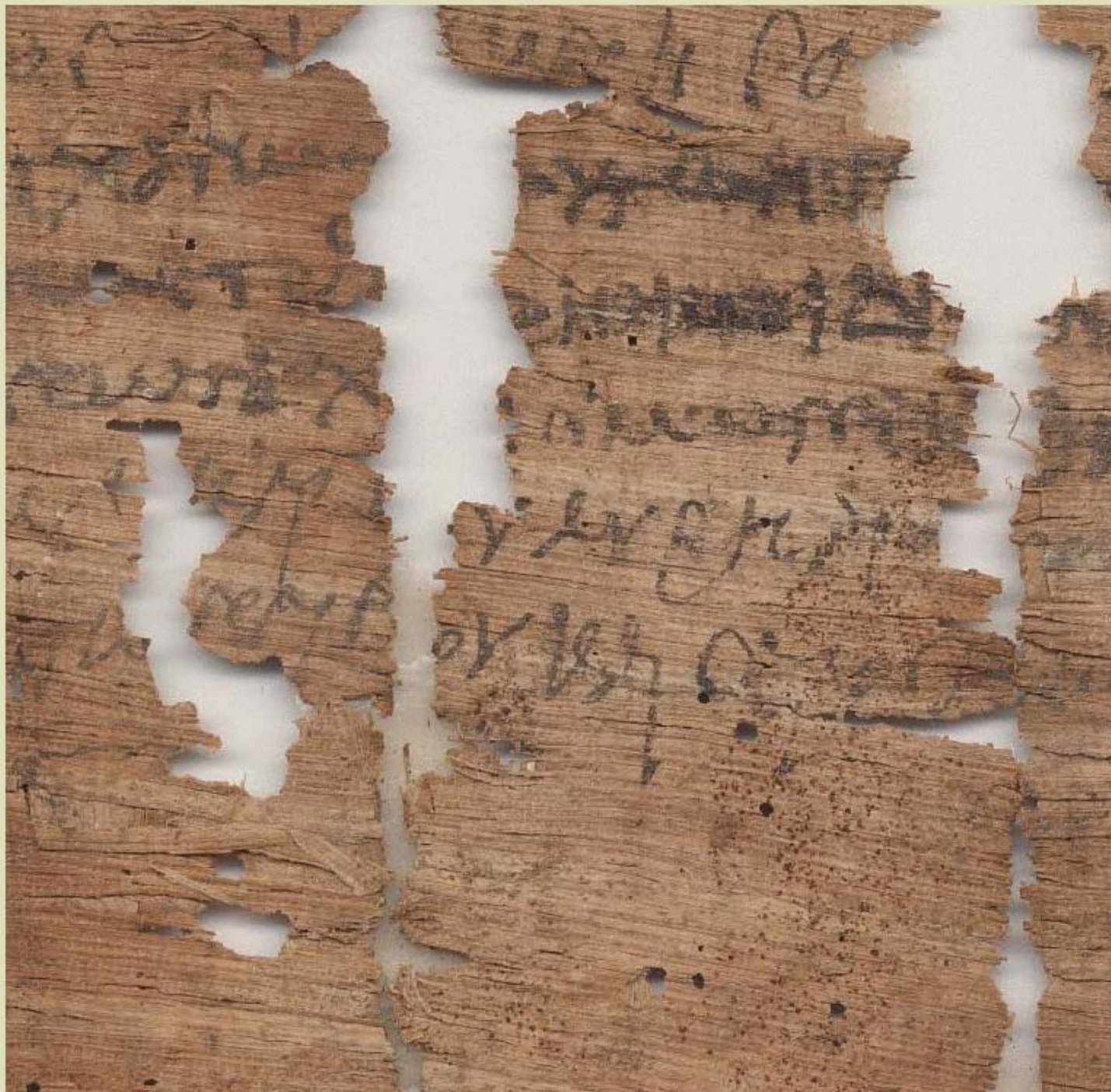
