Platform dedicated to organisers of conferences, workshops or scientific meetings















Background


Continue developing the HAL national open archive

HAL deposits are encouraged or required by :


- researchers' institutions

This work was part of the HALiance project, funded by the French National Research Agency (ANR)
































Creating the suggestion database - Key figures

~ 72,000 scholarly works missing from HAL for the period 2014 > 2023

- Publication date from 2014 to 2023
- Updated once a month
- Mainly published articles and book chapters
- All scientific disciplines




Breakdown of the number of scholarly works missing from HAL per year



Access to suggestions for researchers

Main challenges

Disciplinary coverage

Scholar fields like Law, Social Science and Humanities are less well represented in the suggestion database.

Metadata enrichment

Lack of affiliation information in metadata

Download article files

Missing information about files license Some links to files cannot be used
