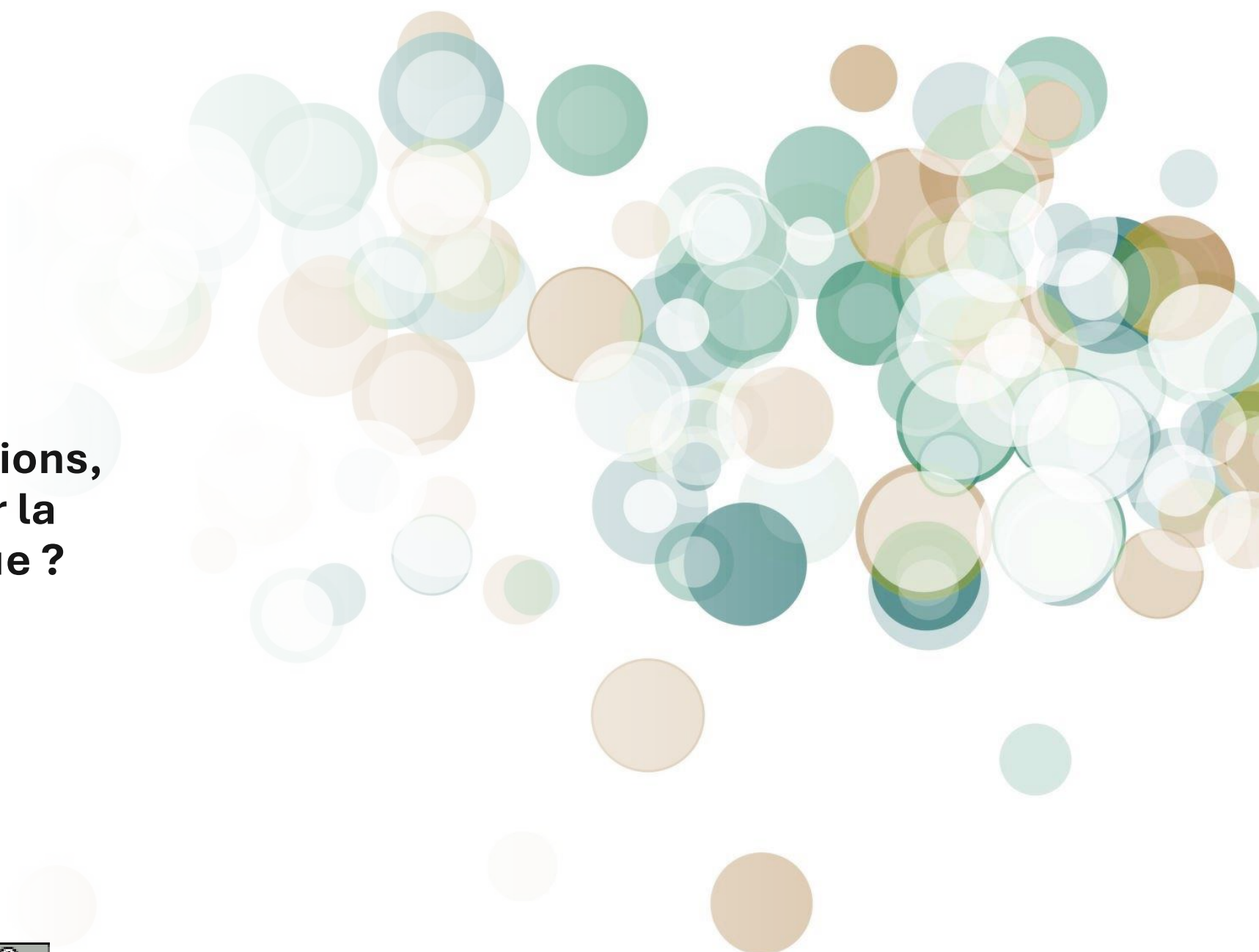

Présentation

Depuis quelques années, de nouveaux moteurs de recherche académique viennent compléter l'offre dominée jusque-là par Google Scholar, Scopus et le Web of Science.

Bibliodiversité, nouveaux types d'informations, science ouverte... A l'heure où des institutions se désabonnent de leurs bases bibliographiques commerciales et où des initiatives permettent une meilleure ouverture des données sur les publications, que peuvent apporter ces outils au chercheur ?

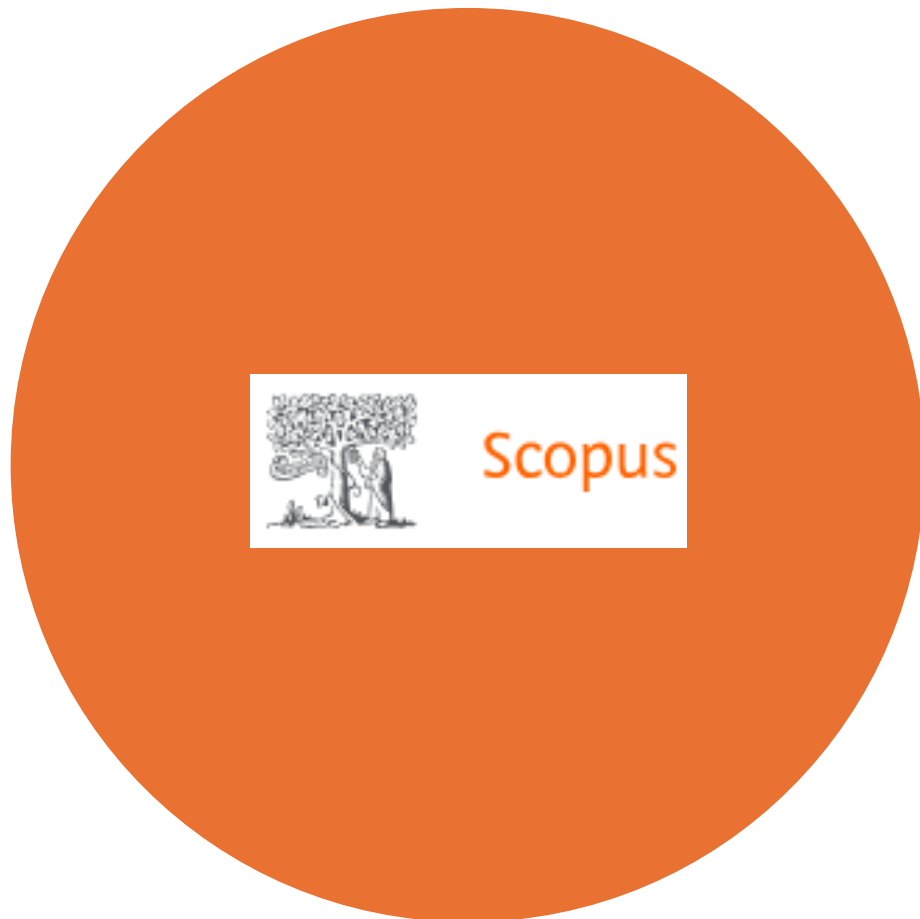

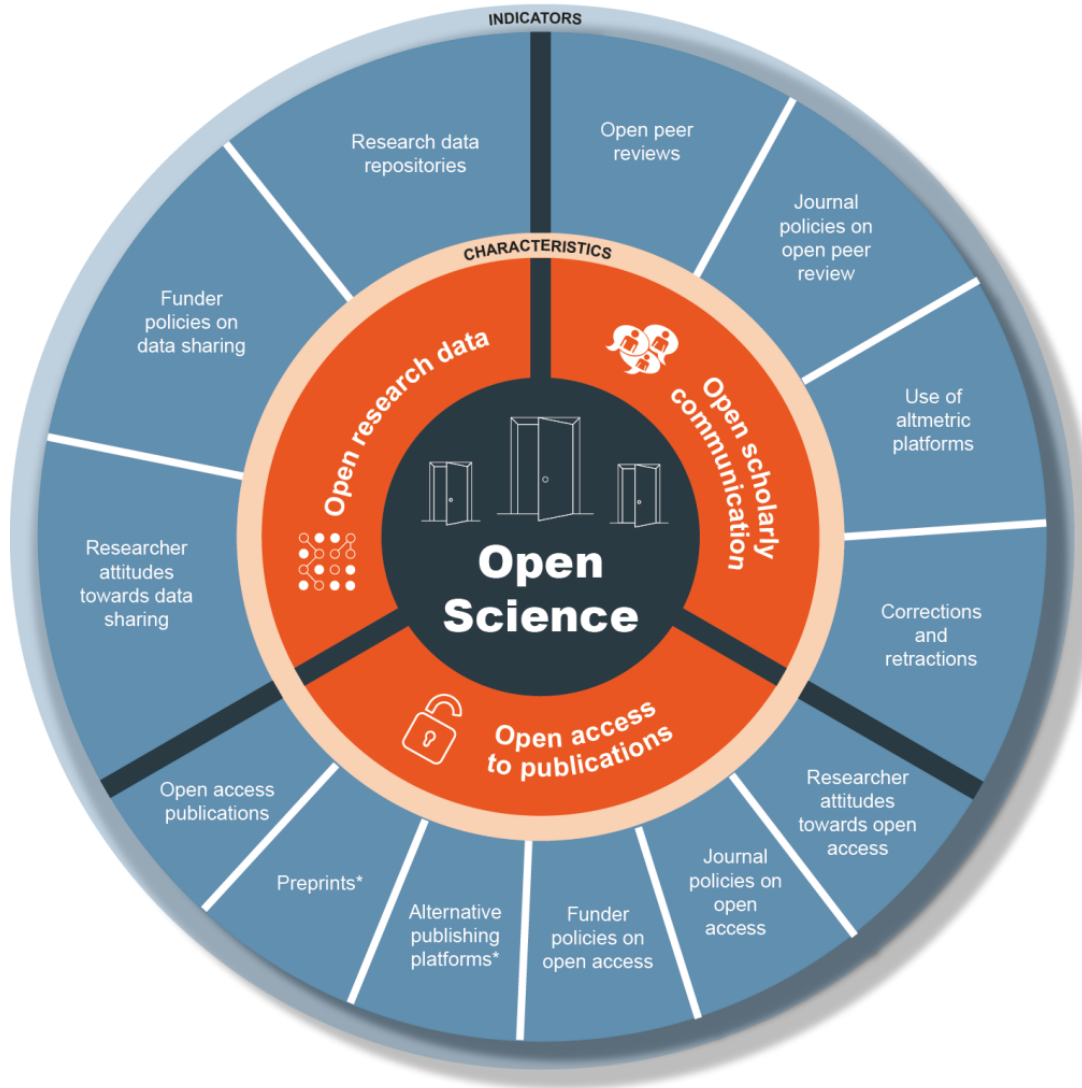

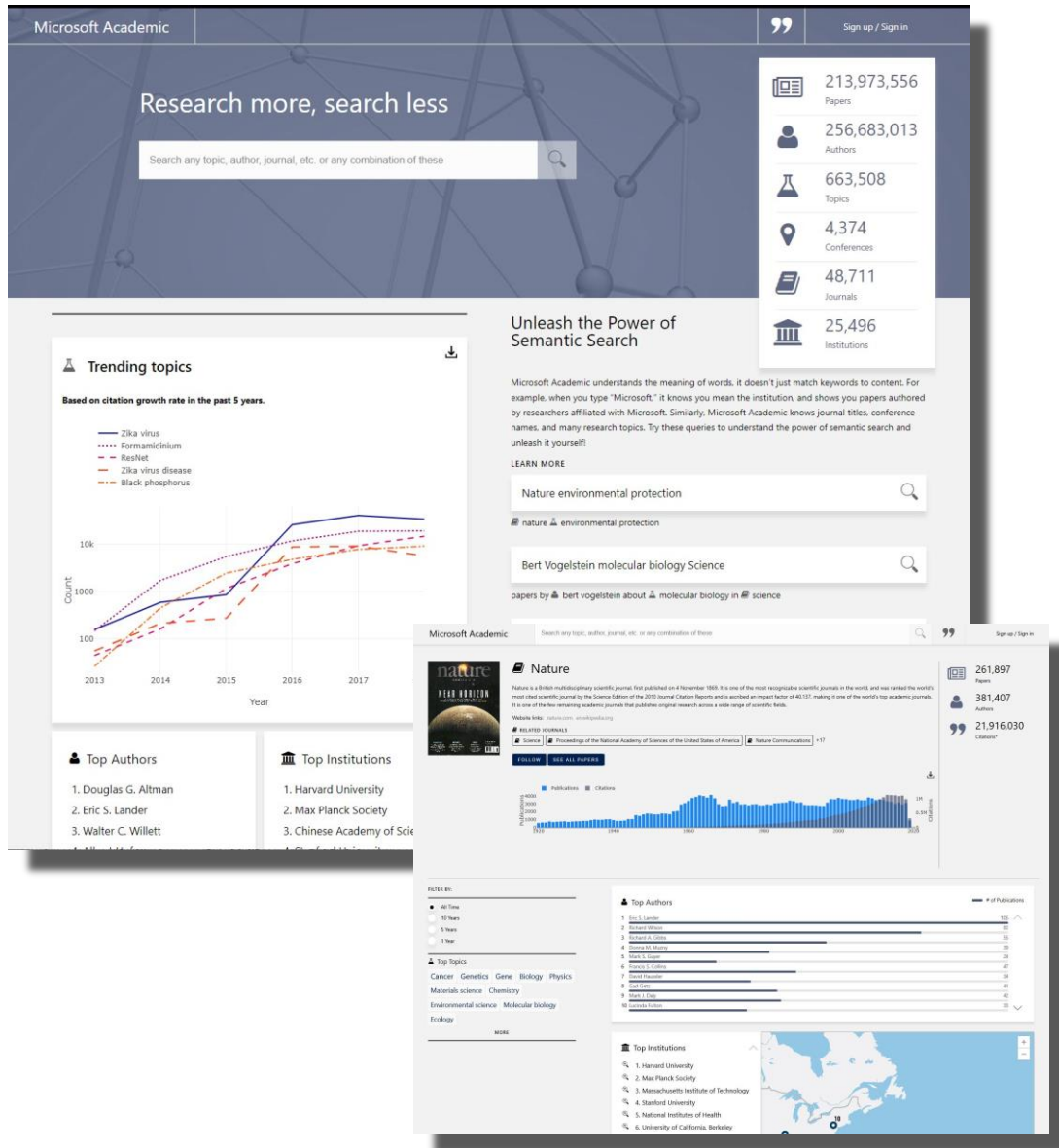
Research evaluation has become routine and often relies on metrics. But it is increasingly driven by data and not by expert judgement. As a result, the procedures that were designed to increase the quality of research are now threatening to damage the scientific system. To support researchers and managers, five experts led by Diana Hicks, professor in the School of Public Policy at Georgia Institute of Technology, and Paul Wouters, director of CWTS at Leiden University, have proposed 10 principles for the measurement of research performance: the Leiden Manifesto for Research Metrics published as a comment in Nature.

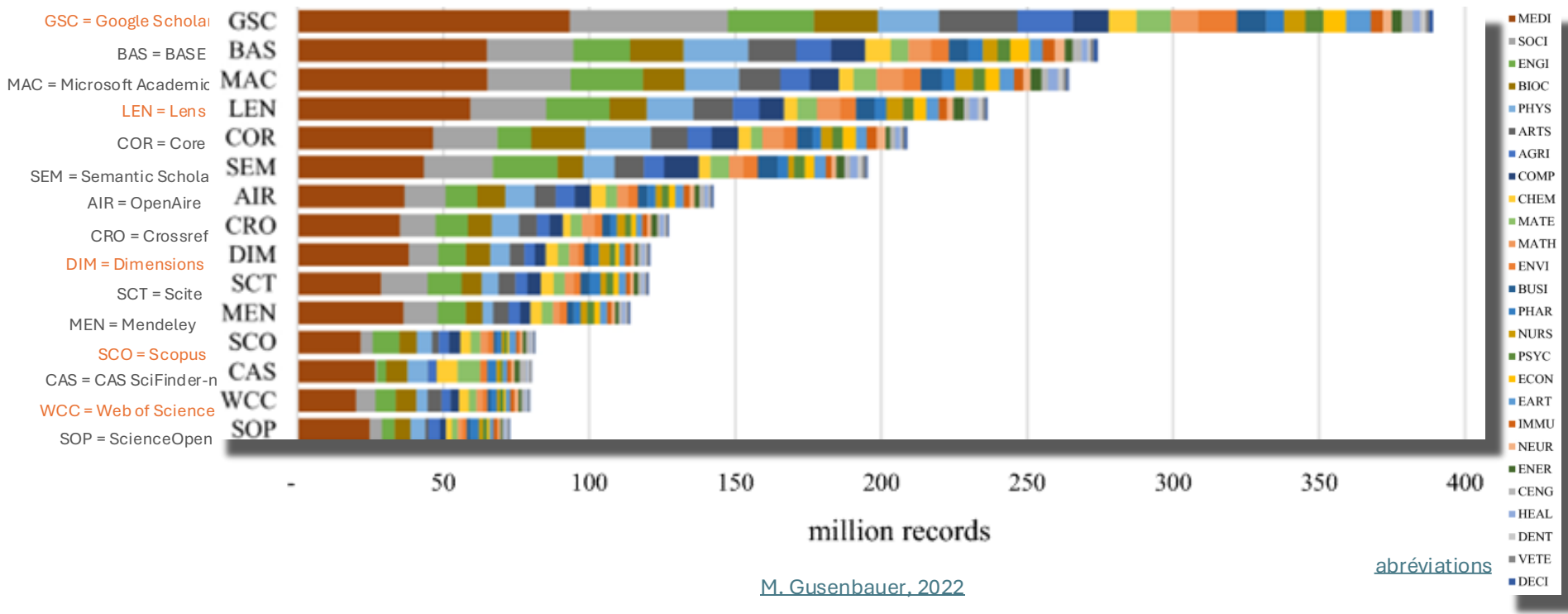

Goodbye, Microsoft Academic – Hello, open research infrastructure?

The announcement of the closure of Microsoft Academic later this year, may have left the research community largely unmoved, although its demise has significant implications for those working with the service's substantial database. Here, Aaron Tay, Alberto Martín-Martín, and Sven E. Hug, discuss what set Microsoft Academic apart from its competitors and the potential consequences of Microsoft's withdrawal from scholarly metadata for the development of open research infrastructures.

Recently, Microsoft announced that it will [shut down Microsoft Academic](#), the second largest academic search engine after Google Scholar. Although the global scientific community took little

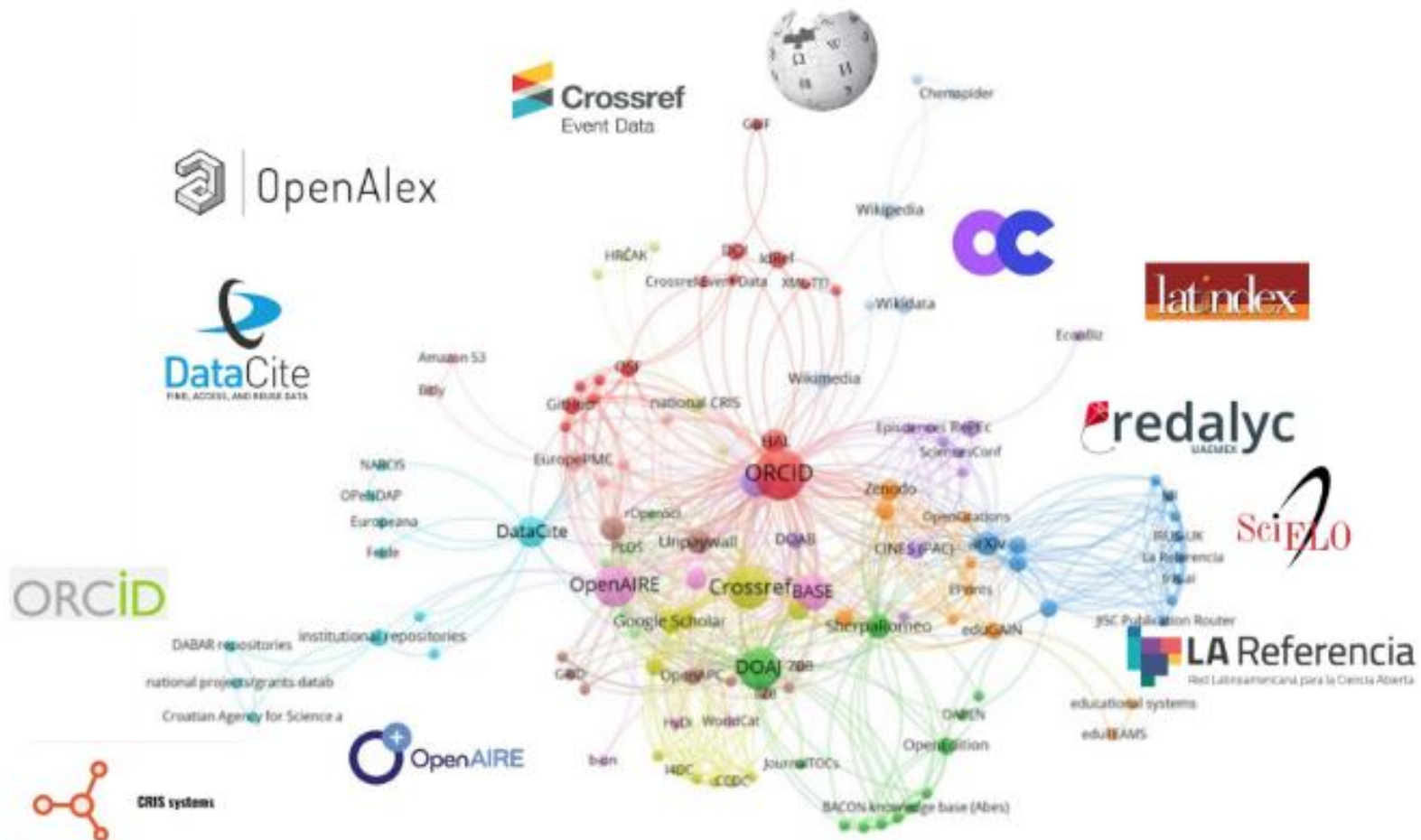
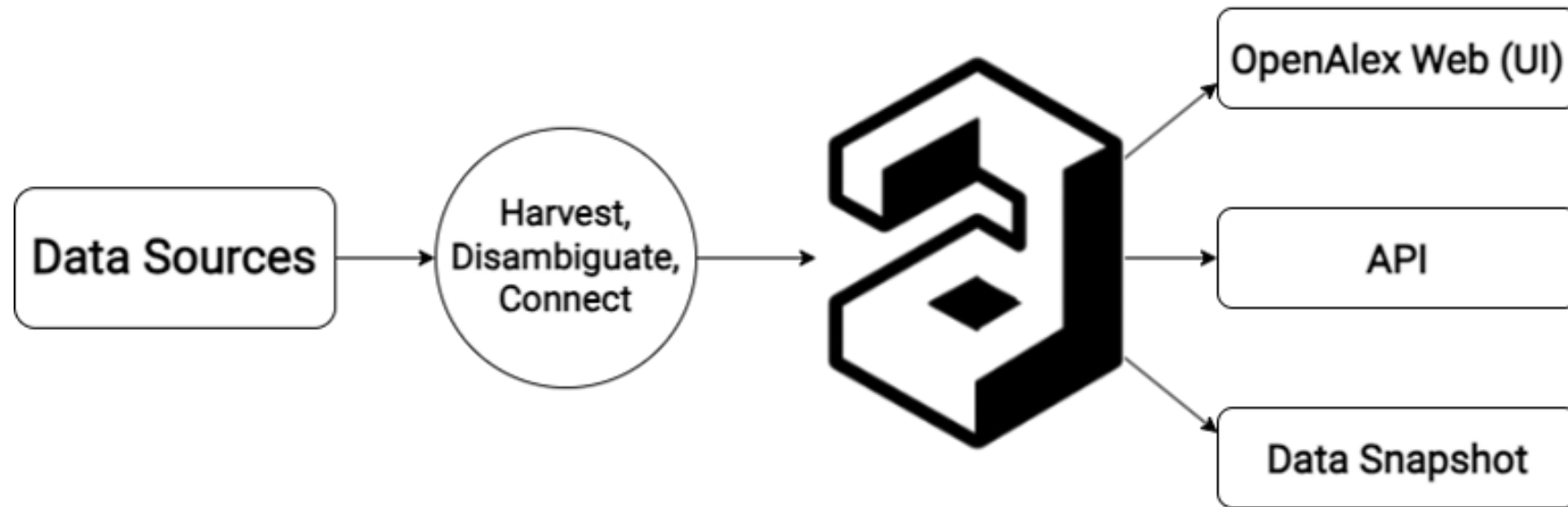


Figure 1. An illustration of a potential federation of open research information sources, with some prominent open research information sources. Based on [Ficarra et al. \(2020\)](#).

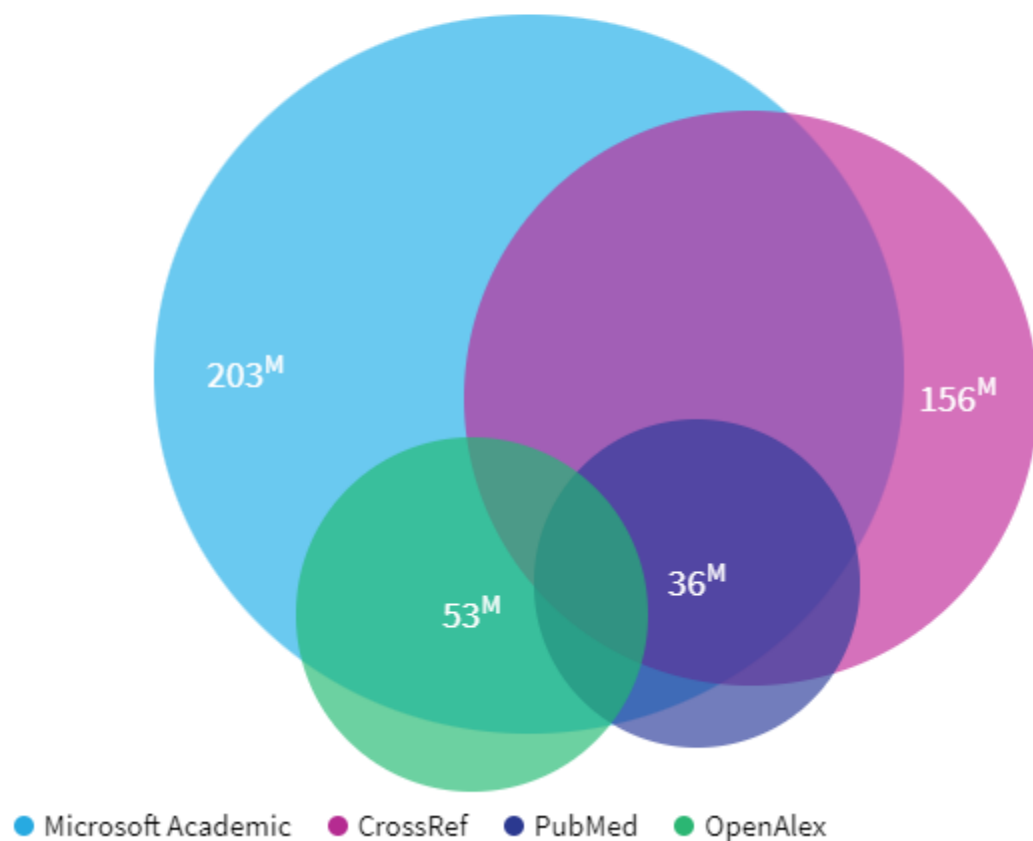

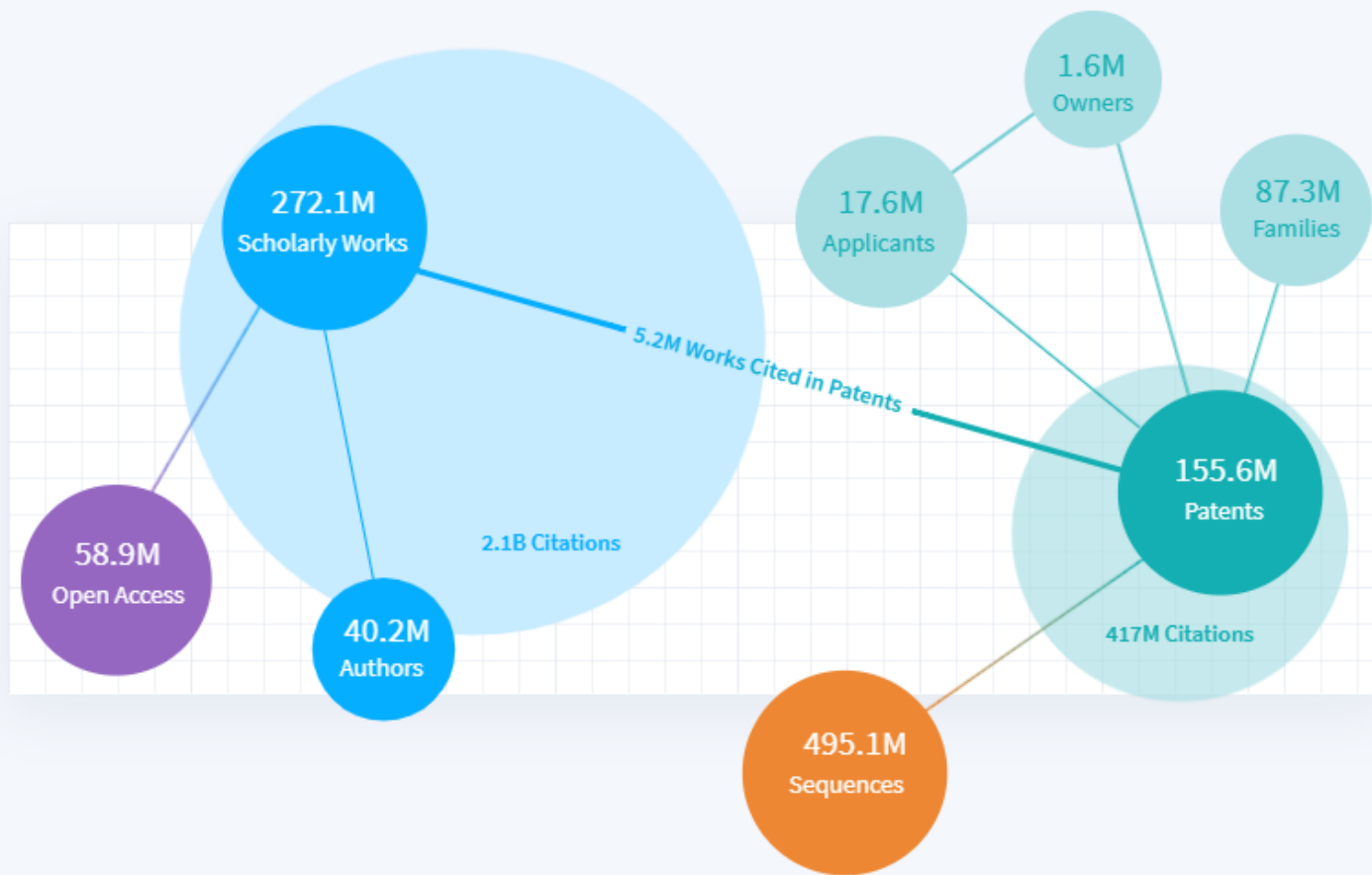

Abstract

The present study investigated the influence of cognitive, motor, and Karate (accordingly the guidelines of the German-Karate-Federation, DKV) training on the cognitive functioning and mental state of older people between 67 and 90 years of age. The three training groups each consisted of 12 elderly participants; the waiting control group included 9 participants. Before the training, participants were evaluated with cognitive measurements (cognitive speed: number-connection test, number-symbol test; memory performance: digit-span test, blocking-tapping test, figure test) and a measurement of emotional wellbeing. After this pre-testing they participated the specific training in on average sixteen 1-h training sessions. The cognitive training exercised inductive thinking ability, the motor training worked on easy stretching and mobilization techniques, and the Karate training taught tasks of self-defense, partner training, and Katas. After completion of the training sessions, all tests were applied again. The results show no significant difference in cognitive improvement dependent on group between the three training conditions. However a significant improvement was found in the emotional mental state measurement for the Karate group compared to the waiting control group. This result suggests that the integrated involvement in Karate leads to a feeling of self-worth and that, even in elderly people, integration of new sports helps to improve quality of life.

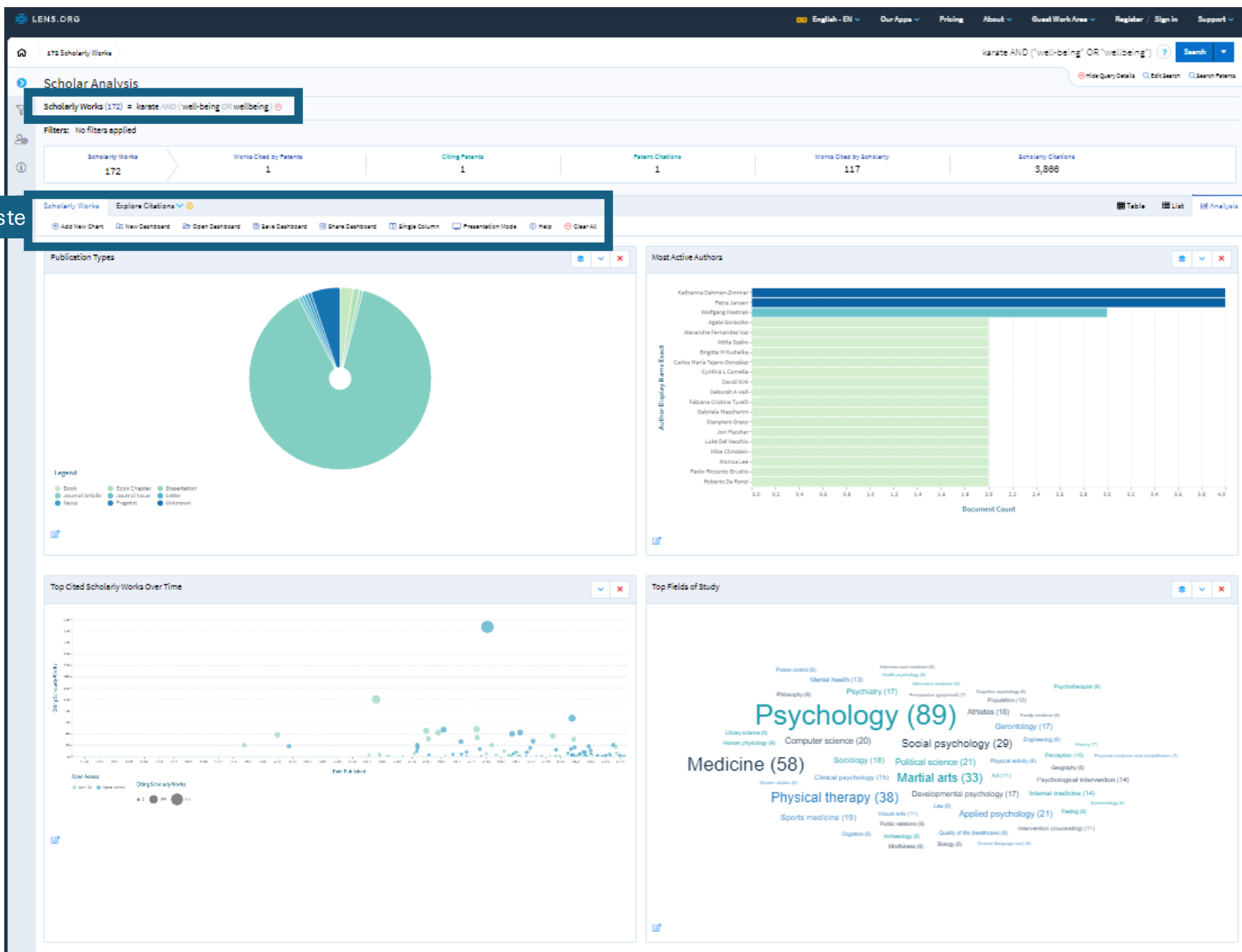

Booleans: Boolean operators must be in capitals: e.g. 'robot **AND** engine' , or 'car **OR** boat' or 'cat **NOT** dog' . **&&** is an alias for **AND** and **||** is an alias for **OR** and **!** is the alias for **NOT**. Parentheses can be used to group search terms. e.g. '(wheat **AND** grain) **OR** (sorgum **AND** barley)'

Fields ⓘ : Search a specific field in the index (or fields) use 'field:term': e.g. 'title:(leishmani* **AND** diagnos*) || abstract:(leishmani* **AND** diagnos*) && classification_cpc:(A61K* **OR** C12N*)'

Wildcards: e.g. *, ?, and regular expressions like /ar[gb]on/

Fuzziness and Proximity Search: To perform a fuzzy search use the tilde, "~", symbol at the end of a Single word Term. For example to search for a term similar in spelling to "roam" use the fuzzy search: roam~ . To perform a proximity search, add the tilde, "~", symbol to the end of a phrase suffixed with a number indicating the maximum edit distance of words in the phrase. For example, "quick fox"~4 searches for *quick* and *fox* within 4 words from each other.

Range Searches: Range Queries allow one to match documents whose field(s) values are between the lower and upper bound specified by the Range Query. Range Queries can be inclusive or exclusive of the upper and lower bounds. Sorting is done lexicographically. `date_published:[2002-01-01 TO 2003-01-01]`

This will find documents whose `date_published` fields have values between 2002-01-01 and 2003-01-01, inclusive. Note that Range Queries are not reserved for date fields. You could also use range queries with non-date fields: `title:{Aida TO Carmen}`

This will find all documents whose titles are between Aida and Carmen, but not including Aida and Carmen. Inclusive range queries are denoted by square brackets. Exclusive range queries are denoted by curly brackets.

Language: To search in a language other than English, use the "Query Tools" section at the bottom of the sidebar filters.

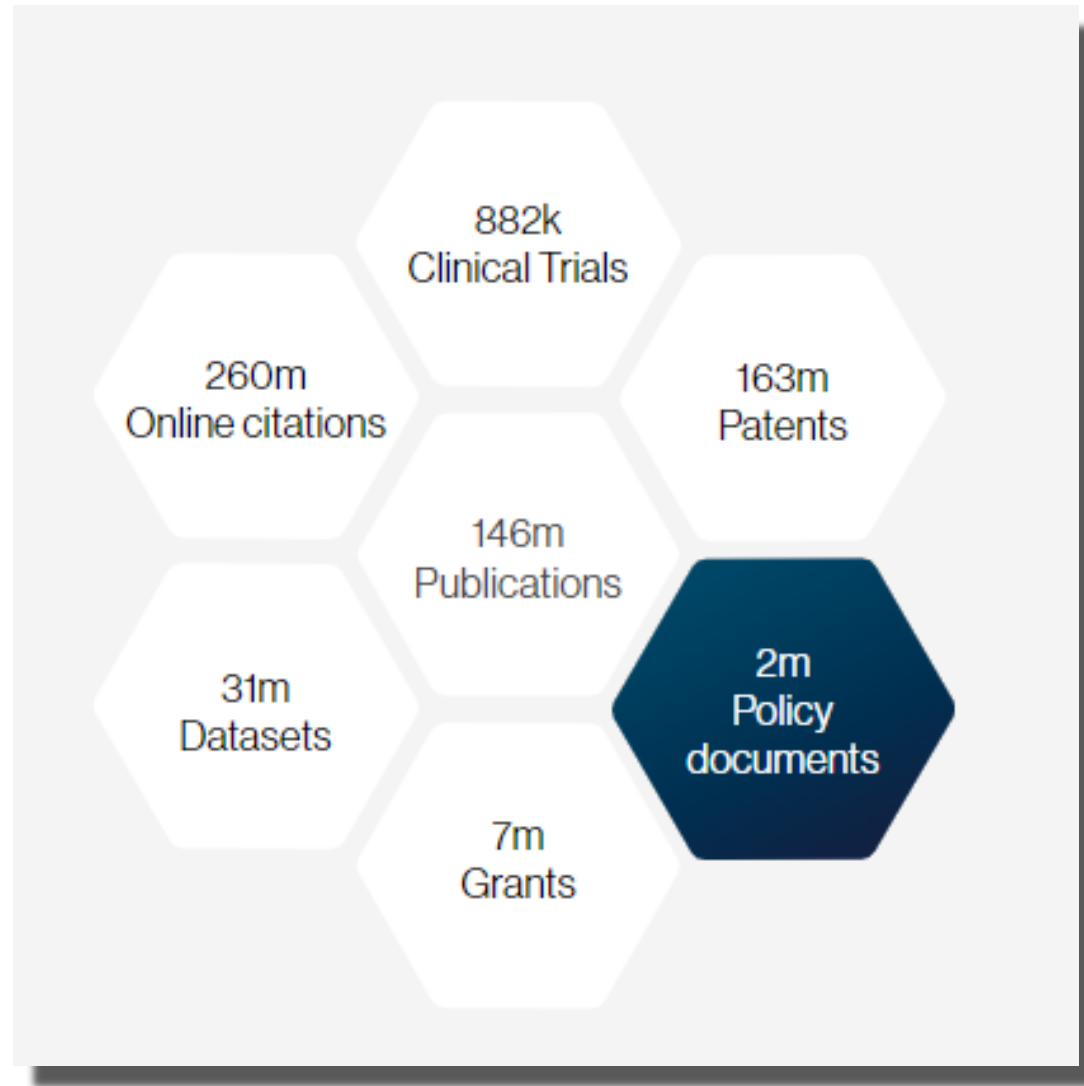

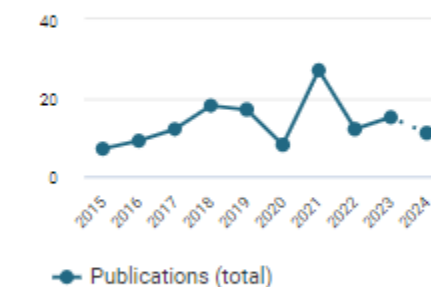

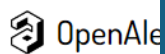
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Fig. 1 Venn diagram of the intersection sizes of unique DOIs based in each database on exact DOI match, for records published between 2015 and 2022

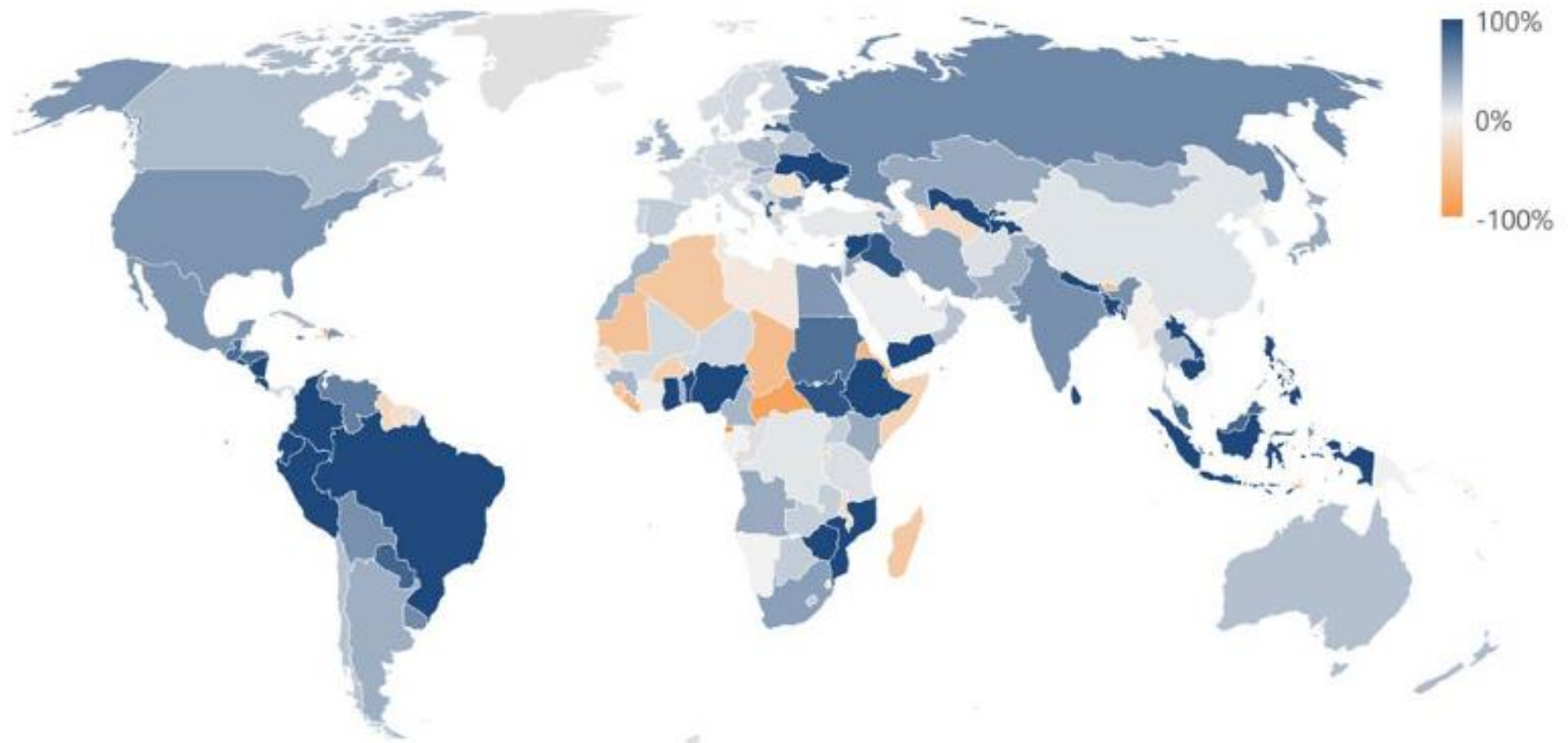
